THE COLLEGE

Model Christian College was founded in 2007 by Arücho Society for Human Transformation and Research, Kohima, a registered education society, which strives to promote quality education for an integrated growth and development of students.

The College is an institution of higher education, offering both Arts and Science streams. It is located at Tsiepfü Tsiepfhe, A.G. Colony, two kilometers away from NH-39. It is a co-educational institution.

The College is approved by the Government of Nagaland and affiliated to Nagaland University. It is recognized by UGC under Section 2f of the UGC Act, 1956. It has applied for Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC.

Motto

“Academic and Moral Excellence” is the motto of the College. Head and Heart makes a person whole. Academic pursuance alone without morality would make the society a hell to be cursed. Logo

The logo bears a book, a pen, three doves over the book and a sheaf of grain on each side which are interlocked at the base. FACILITIES

Library

The College has a well-maintained library with volumes of books in different subjects. There are about three thousand books that students can refer from and have access to. Library cards are issued with which books can be availed on specific terms and conditions.

Laboratory

The College has well equipped Science Laboratories for Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Geology and Geography. High quality and essential equipments, chemicals and specimens are available for practicals. Students are given ample opportunities to operate and experiment on the lab equipments so that they gain first-hand knowledge. The labs are maintained and functioned under the supervision and care of an able lab-assistant and lab-bearer. Students are constantly guided and helped by the teachers as well as lab-assistant and lab-bearer on all the practical works.

Transportation

There are college buses, which can be utilized by the students in need, by procuring Tickets. The mode of payment depends on the distance between the College and the boarding point. Tickets can be obtained from the College counter and is payable every month.

Hostel

The College Campus has hostels for both boys and girls. Good care, comfortable accommodation, ample study hours, counselling and consultation are rendered to the hostellers. A full time in-house Chaplain takes care of all the needs of the hostellers. There are also several other private hostels, for both boys and girls, in the area.

Computer lab

A computer lab is readily available for practical purposes, as well as for easy access to scholarly works and needs. The syllabi of Botany, Zoology & Chemistry calls for computer knowledge, which is taught and guided by an IT educator.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

STUDENT CARE AND CHAPLAINCY

The College has a dedicated team of teaching and non-teaching staff to cater to the needs of the students apart from academic learning. A full time in-house Chaplain provides counselling and sees to the spiritual welfare of the students. Dean of Students is appointed from among the lecturers. Disciplinary matters such as delinquency, anti-social behavior, consumption of intoxicant substances, etc., are taken care of by the Dean.

TRANSFER

- The college reserves the right of issuing transfer/withdrawal certificate to any student if his/her conduct and performance are not satisfactory or are harmful to others.
- Transfer certificate shall be issued after all dues and liabilities are cleared by the student.

- Following withdrawal from the College after admission, one shall not claim refund of any fees.

AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

- The student who secures the First Position among toppers, in any discipline, in the 6th semester university result, shall be awarded Rs 5000/- by the institution.
- Students who secure an aggregate of 80% and above during any of the semester exams will be awarded a scholarship of Rs 1000/-.
- Students securing 100% attendance in a semester will be awarded a citation.
- A full scholarship (Admission/ Annual & Tuition fees) will be provided for two orphans from any recognized orphanage home.

FACULTY

With that in mind, recruitment is done with great care that only qualified and experienced teachers with a mind set to impart knowledge and influence young minds are selected to be a part of the teaching community. Eligibility for B.Sc. Semester & B.A 1st Semester

- 10+2 or equivalent courses with 1st and 2nd Division are eligible for admission to B.Sc. 1st Semester.
- A student who passed 10+2 or equivalent courses is eligible for admission to B.A 1st Semester.
- Students seeking Honours in both B.Sc. and B.A. must secure a minimum of 45% in the concerned subject.
- Applications for admission should reach the College office within the stipulated time specified by the institution.

Science Stream

Science students may opt for Honours in any of the following subjects:

Arts students may opt for Honours in any of the following subjects:

- **Elective English shall be compulsory for English Honours Students.**
- **Elective English may be opted by any student.**

Compulsory Subjects for Arts Stream:

- a. General English
- b. Alternative English
- c. Environment Studies
- d. Choice Based Credit Paper

Elective Subject Combinations:

A Student may choose any three from the following elective papers:

- a. Education
- b. Elective English
- c. History
- d. Political Science
- e. Sociology

Documents to be submitted at the time of Admission

- Attested Photocopies of Admit Cards and Mark Sheets of HSLC and HSSLC examination (1 copy each)
- Registration Card, in ORIGINAL, of the Board / University previously studied.
- Passed Certificate from respective boards/Universities.
- Students coming from other Boards/Universities shall have to produce Migration Certificate from their respective Boards / Universities.
- Recent Pass port size Photograph (2 copies)

UNIFORM

Students must wear uniform on all days of the week except on Saturday.

- Students must wear full uniform on Monday, Wednesday and Friday (only black formal shoes will be allowed.)
- Students must wear the college t-shirt along with blazer on Tuesday and Thursday.
- Students can wear casual clothes on Saturday. However, shorts and skirts will not be allowed.

General Rules and Regulations

1. Every student is to abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
2. Every student must wear clean and proper uniform on the allotted days.
3. Indecent dressing is not allowed on the days allotted for civil dresses or any college function days.
4. Abuse of Drugs, use of Tobacco, chewing Pan, Talab, Smoking, Alcohol or any kind of intoxicant substances are strictly prohibited.
5. It is mandatory for all students to attend classes.
6. Students are required to attend all the functions, seminars, and conference organized by the College.
7. Any student can and will be asked to leave the college on the grounds of breach of discipline, irregular attendance, poor academic performance and non-payment of fees.
8. Any damage done to any apparatus or article in Science Laboratories / College properties will be replaced by the concerned student. Any loss or damage of College Library Books will have to be replaced by the concerned student or as deemed best by the authority.
9. Showing discourtesy and insubordination to Authority, Staff, and Faculty will be liable to disciplinary action.
10. No Union, Society, Organization, or Group Meetings will be allowed in the College without prior permission of the concerned authority.
11. A student will not be allowed to sit for examination if attendance in class is below 80%.
12. Any Student using indecent, vulgar, and abusive language or violence towards other students will be liable to disciplinary action.
13. Complaint in any form in-group will not be entertained.
14. Conspirators and instigators in any derogatory form will be dealt with serious disciplinary action.
15. Absenting oneself from any period/class by bunking, non-cooperation in doing assignments, tests and examinations can lead to serious disciplinary action.
16. Mobile phones, cameras, etc. are not allowed in the class. In case of violation, the appliance will be confiscated. The College will not be responsible for loss of such appliance.
17. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited.
18. The College expects moral and spiritual excellence from every student.
19. Uniform will be supplied by the College on payment.
