**GENERAL GUIDELINES ON INTRODUCTION OF SEMESTER SYSTEM AT THE  
UNDER GRADUATE (UG) LEVEL BEGINNING FROM ACADEMIC SESSION, 2012**

**FOR B.A./ B.SC./ BCA/B.COM. and BBA STREAMS**

**1. INTRODUCTION**

Semester mode of Teaching and Examination in Indian Universities has become a National Policy. The UGC has now made it mandatory for all the Institutions of Higher Learning and affiliated Colleges in the country. A good number of Universities have already started implementing this new system of Education. Nagaland University in its Academic Council (AC) meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> November, 2011 has taken the decision to introduce the semester system in all the affiliated Colleges. In pursuance of this decision, the AC has approved the Course Curriculum and Syllabi developed by the respective Boards of Undergraduate Studies (BUGS) and resolved to start Semester System in the Colleges from the Academic Session, 2012 in a phased manner. These guidelines have been approved by the AC in its 14<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2012.

The entire Course Curriculum and Syllabi have been designed by the respective BUGS keeping in view the needs of the present generation. It is a learner friendly programme suitable to meet the requirements of students in a competitive world. Therefore, it is expected that this will create a better teaching-learning spirit in the Institutions of Higher Education for which both teachers and students shall have to work more sincerely.

The Course Curriculum and Syllabi shall be revised/updated whenever necessary and compulsorily in every three years.

**2. DURATION OF SEMESTER SYSTEM AND ACADEMIC YEAR**

A Minimum of 3 years (6 Semesters) and a Maximum of 5 years (10 Semesters) shall be required to qualify for the B.A./ B.Sc./BCA/ B.Com., and BBA Degree. The duration of Semester I, III and V shall be from July to December (6 months) during which Admission, Course Work, Conduct of Examinations and Declaration of Results shall be completed including Semester Break. The duration of Semester II, IV and VI shall be from January to June (6 months) during which Admission, Course Work, Conduct of Examinations and Declaration of Results shall be completed, including Semester Break. Every College shall offer uniform pattern of Credit Loads and follow uniform Academic Calendar in each Semester. Academic Calendar shall be prepared by the University.

**3. COMBINATION/ SELECTION OF PAPERS**

- 1) For Honours Course, Total Elective Papers shall be 6 and Total Honours Papers shall be 8 or 7 + 1 Project Paper apart from other common courses like English, M.L., EVS carrying 100 Marks each.
- 2) For the Pass Course, there shall be 6 papers in each Elective Subject carrying 100 Marks each. Course combination structure both for Arts and Science indicating minimum number of Papers/Marks in different streams are demonstrated in Annexure I, which may vary depending on the choice of papers by students.
