

A Two day national seminar on ‘Federal Democracy and Ethnic Identity: Challenges and Prospect’ was organized by departments of Political Science, Sociology and History, Model Christian College, Kohima, Nagaland on 23<sup>rd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> November 2017. The seminar started with prayer by Mr. Mathew and welcome address was given by Dr. Luke Rymbai, principal of the organizing college. In his welcome address, he introduced all the paper presenters and guests among the audience. Key note address was presented in details by Dr. N.K. Das, social anthropologist & former deputy director, Anthropological Survey of India, Kolkata, who is popularly known as Dr. Naga Das, and is rightly called so, as he has visited and stayed in many villages in Nagaland doing research and other activities since 1978, and has also written several books and articles on Nagaland. The guest of honor was Prof. R.C. Gupta, pro-vice chancellor, Meriema Campus, Kohima, Nagaland University. He cited the example of United States democracy, where territory cannot be changed, in European Union, under certain condition, any country can join or leave, but in case of Indian federalism, it is flexible. He strongly believes that Indian flexible democracy can accommodate and solve any challenges of democracy. In all, there were five sessions and 14 paper presenters, including two joint papers.



## Seminar on 'Federal Democracy & Ethnic Identity: Challenges and Prospects' held

**KOHIMA, NOVEMBER 27 (MEXN):** The Departments of Political Science, Sociology and History of Model Christian College organized a National Seminar on the topic 'Federal Democracy and Ethnic Identity: Challenges and Prospects' on November 24 and 25 with Prof R.C. Gupta, Pro-Vice Chancellor, N.U., Meriema Campus, Kohima as the guest of honour.

While delivering the keynote address, Dr. NK Das, Social Anthropologist and former Dy. Director, Anthropological Survey of India, Kolkata, said that "India needs a clear debate on federation." Prof. Gupta, in his speech mentioned about India as a diversified country with a long history of invaders which makes the country rich in culture and traditions. He summed up by saying that education is the only solution to mitigate challenges prevailing in the country.

A press note received here stated that the two day seminar was divided into 5 sessions with 14 present-

ers from different states like Telengana, Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, Sikkim, Assam and Nagaland.

Dr. Mondal highlighted various issues and challenges like money power, muscle power, candidates with criminal backgrounds and also illiteracy in India. On the other hand, Mr. Zahir Ahmad Butt shared about the glorious history of Kashmir before Indian Independence. He compared the post-colonial situation of the Nagas and the Kashmiris and an analysis on the political disputes between the center and these

states. Dr. Haripriya mentioned about nationalism in the context of North-East as a part of ethnicity and poetry reflecting the identity representing the field of colonial relations. In the following sessions, the topics focused on the issues of women in society and politics. Dr. Esita addressed the issues of Muslim women in democratic politics, while Ms. Swuro talked about Naga Women's representation in politics. Further Dr. NK Das talked about the Indo-Naga Framework Agreement. The seminar wound up with Dr. Ray,

who spoke on the topic "Indian DNA: Genomics and the Making of a Nation".

Lastly, the seminar ended with a valedictory session with Dr. Mondal highlighting the presentation of the two day event along with the topics while Dr. Debbarma gave a critique of the seminar. Mr. K. Meyiesul Chaya, Asst. Professor, Model Christian College concluded with a vote of thanks and expressed his special gratitude to ICSSR (Shillong) and the Governor of Nagaland, P.B. 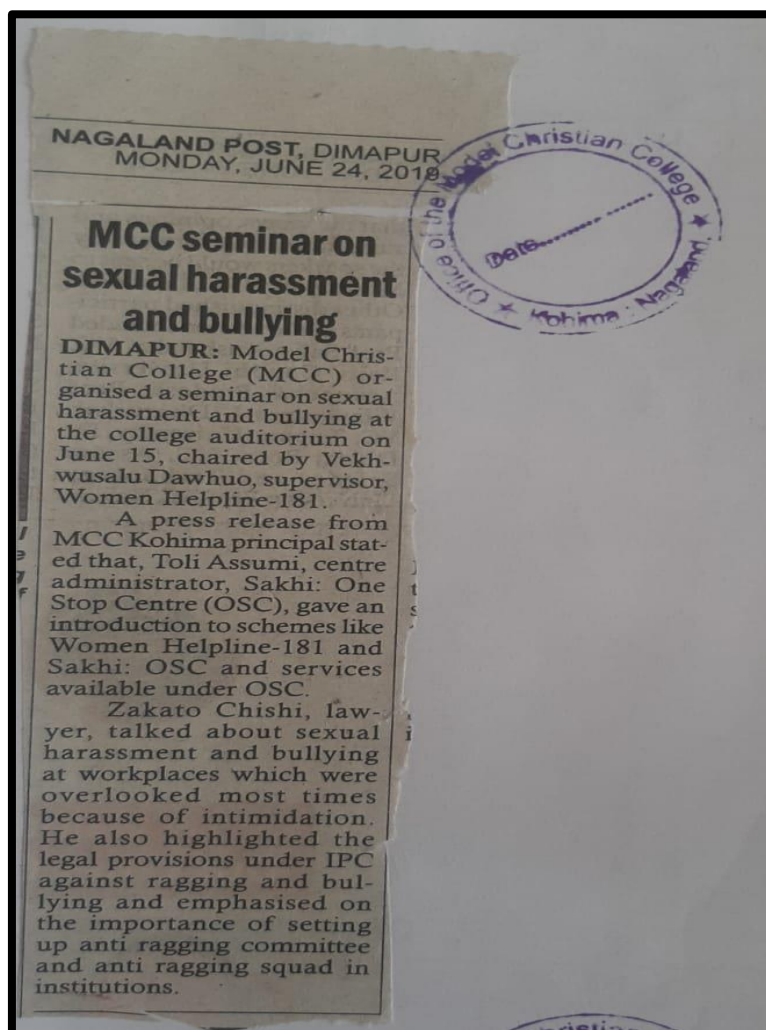
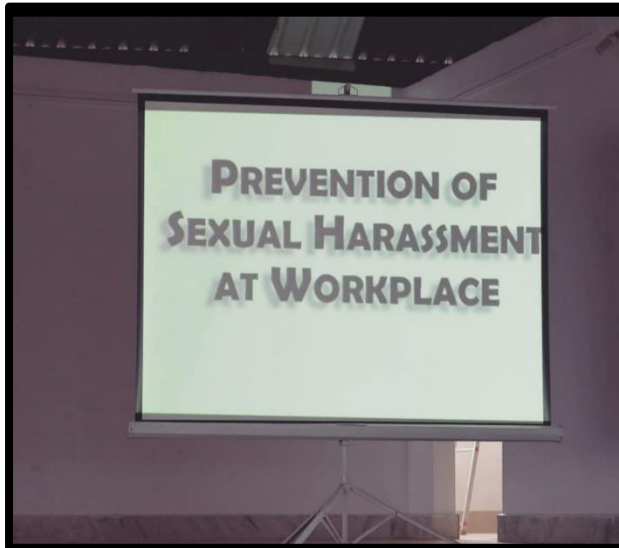






<b>Name of the Programme</b>	<b>Seminar on ‘Sexual harassment &amp; Bullying’</b>

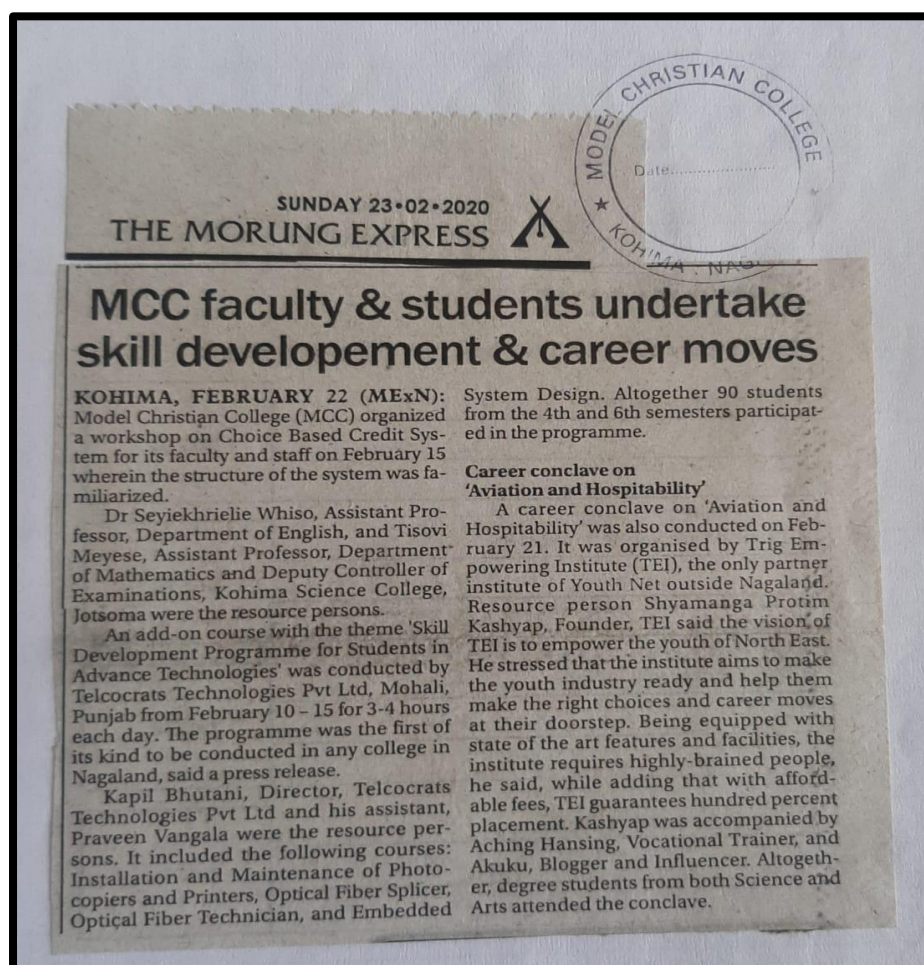

## Webinar on 'landslide susceptibility of Kohima town'

DIMAPUR: Department of geology, Model Christian College (MCC) conducted a live national webinar on March 26 under the topic, "landslide susceptibility of Kohima town, Nagaland". Professor, department of geology, Nagaland University (NU) Dr. GT Thong was the resource person.

Dr. GT Thong spoke on taking heuristic approach on the slope stability as well as the drainage density of the state capital, Kohima. Thong observed that people were in a rush to buy and put up buildings anywhere, regardless of the quality of the land which put many lives in danger.

Geology students have the responsibility to create the awareness on such hazards he said, while encouraging the participants to opt for eco-friendly technology and to adopt indigenous practices wherever applicable.

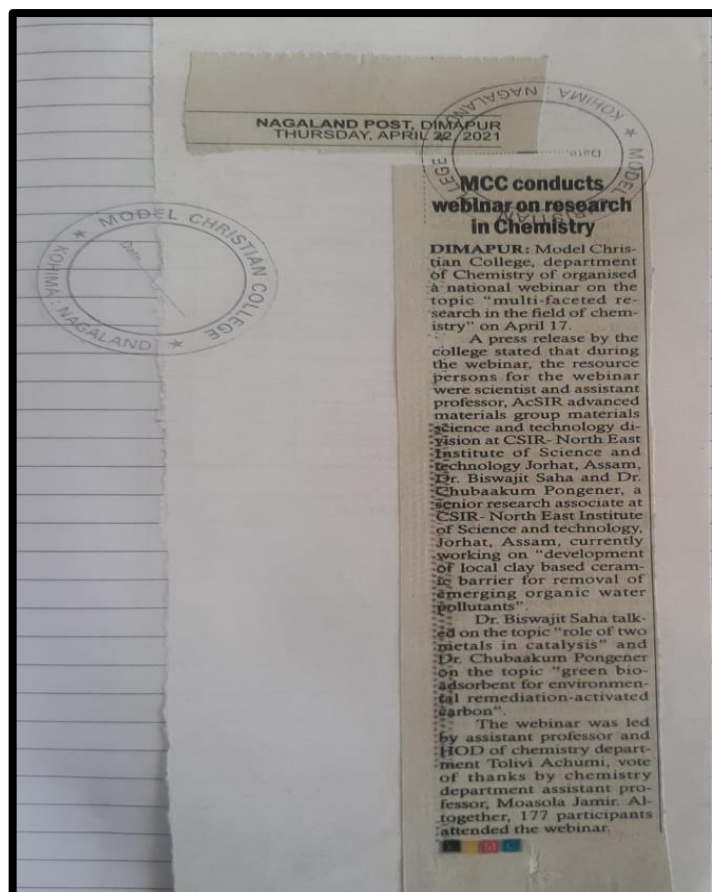

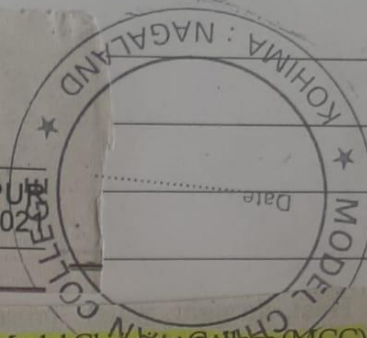
