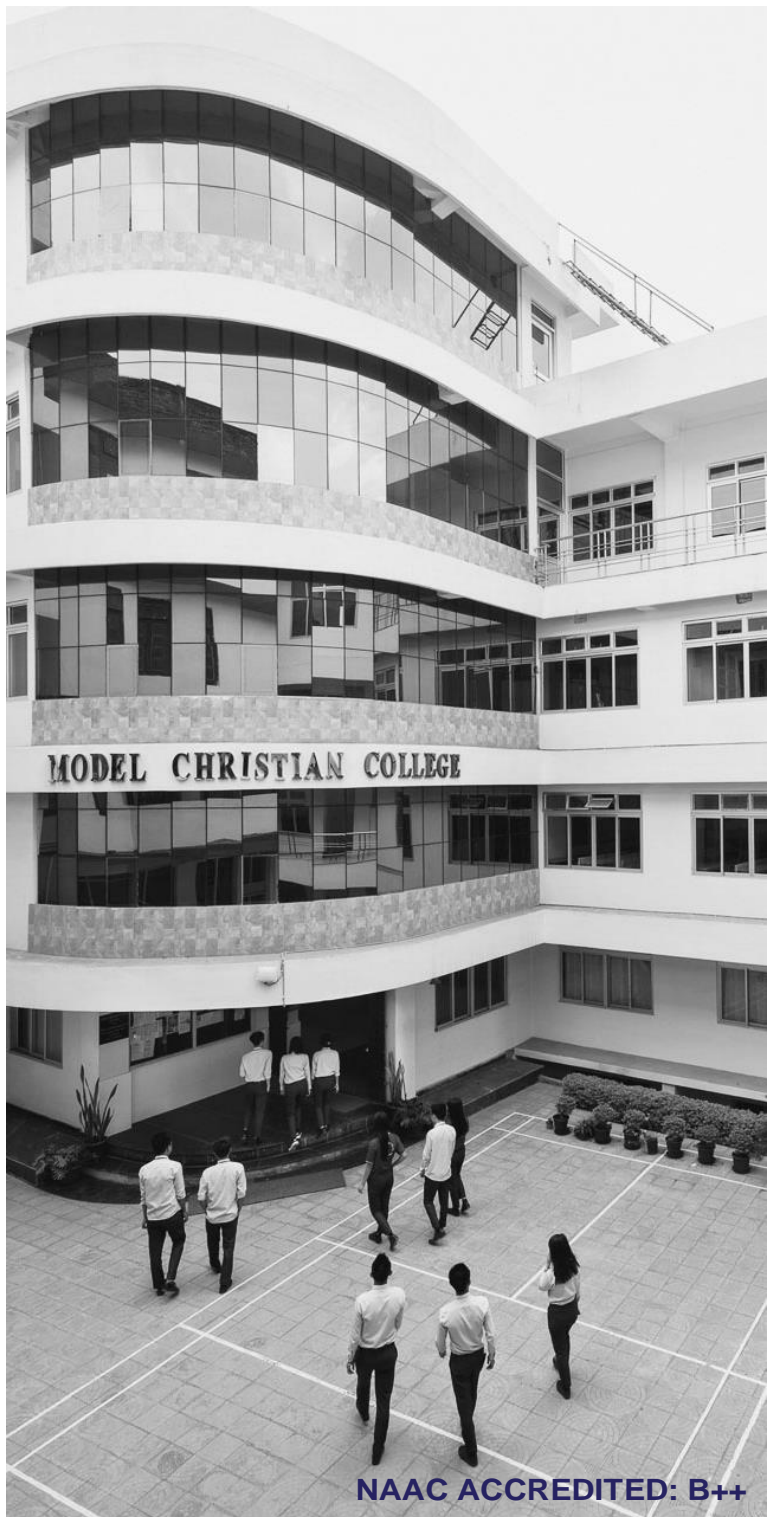

DURATION OF THE UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMME

The duration of the UG programme is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students, who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first or second year, the student will be given a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided they secure the prescribed number of credits and complete one vocational course of the required credits. Students who exit with a UG certificate or UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE

A Bachelor of Science opens up a world of opportunity, whether you dream of joining the forefront of research, learning how to analyse and think critically or making the planet a better place.

MCC aims at providing world-class labs and facilities to help engage the students. The 4 year programme allows you to find your own path and gain essential knowledge in your chosen stream.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

The College adopts an intensive system of education, based on lecture supported by interactive learning and tutorial work. Students are constantly monitored in their studies. This is done through assignments, seminars, tests, etc. Some academic activities include:

- Seminar, workshop, symposium, guest lecture
- Certificate Course in Computer Application, approved by the Directorate of Higher Technical Education, Government of Nagaland.
- Certificate Course in Basic English Language Skills, approved by Nagaland University.

WORK STUDY PROGRAMME

Work Study is a paid initiative programme taken up by the College to provide hands-on work experience to students. This programme allows the students to pursue their studies while having a flexible part-time job. Not only do they gain work experience but also learn about teamwork, customer service, time management and so on. This initiative is to give students the opportunity to earn as they study.

CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT

Apart from academic activities, we feel that students require outstation study tours, local field trips, academic competitions, sports week, etc., which are integrated into the course of their study. The objective of undertaking such activities is to make every student fully competent and confident in themselves.

AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

- The Gold Medalist (First Position among Toppers) in the final semester University result shall be awarded Rs. 10,000/- by the institution.
- A student who secures the First Position among toppers, in any discipline, in the 6th semester University result, shall be awarded Rs 5000/- by the institution.
- Students who secure an aggregate of 80% and above during any of the semester examinations will be awarded a scholarship of Rs 1000/-.
- Students securing 100% attendance in a semester will be awarded a citation.
- A full scholarship (Admission/Annual & Tuition Fees) will be provided for two orphans from any recognized orphanage. Conditions will apply.
- A full scholarship (Admission/Annual & Tuition Fees) for all the semesters will be provided for the First Rank Holder in any stream in HSSLC.
- Free Admission/Annual Fees for all the semesters will be provided for those who secure Second to Tenth Ranks in any stream in HSSLC.

STUDENT SUPPORT

The College has a dedicated team of Faculty and Staff to cater to the academic and non-academic needs of students.

- A full time Chaplain and a Counsellor provide counselling and see to the spiritual welfare of students.
- An in-house Nurse provides round the clock healthcare services to the faculty, staff, students and hostelers. A doctor is also available, when required.
- The Vice-Principal looks after disciplinary matters such as delinquency, behavioural issues, consumption of intoxicating substances, etc.

UNIFORM RULES

- Students must wear full uniform (blazer, black sweater, shirt, pant, tie, black/white socks) on Monday, Wednesday and College Function days.
- Students must wear the College polo shirt with full uniform on Tuesday.
- Students must wear Department or College polo shirt with full uniform on Thursday. On the first Thursday of the month, students must wear a piece of cultural attire or symbol.
- Students are allowed to wear regular but appropriate clothing or the College sweatshirt/hoodie on Friday and Saturday.
- Uniforms will be supplied by the College upon payment

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students are to abide by the following rules and regulations of the College.

- Students must attend classes regularly.
 - Students will not be allowed to sit for the End Semester Examination if their attendance in class is below 80%.
 - Non-cooperation in internal assessment activities such as assignments, tests and seminars will result in serious disciplinary action.
 - Students will be asked to leave the College on grounds of breach of discipline, irregular attendance, and non-payment of fees.
 - Discourtesy and insubordination to Authority, Faculty and Staff will incur disciplinary action.
 - Damage to College property or any apparatus/article in the science laboratories will be replaced by the concerned student.
 - Any loss or damage of College library books have to be replaced by the concerned student.
 - No union, society, organization, or group – except the Model Christian College Students Council (MCCSC) - will be allowed in the College.
 - General Meetings of the MCCSC will be conducted only with prior permission of the College Authority.
 - Any student using indecent, vulgar and abusive language or violence towards other students will be liable to disciplinary action.
 - Conspirators and instigators in any form will face serious disciplinary action.
 - Use of mobile phones, unless required for class purposes with the teacher's permission, is not allowed during the classes. In case of violation, the device will be confiscated. The College will not be responsible for loss of such devices.
 - Students are expected to attend all functions, seminars, and conferences organized by the College.
 - Fundraising of any kind would require permission from the College Authority.
 - Model Christian College is a Tobacco, Alcohol and Drug Free Institution. Use of any such substances is strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be taken against defaulters. For a grave offence, the offender will be expelled with immediate effect.
 - Ragging and sexual harassment of any form is strictly prohibited.
